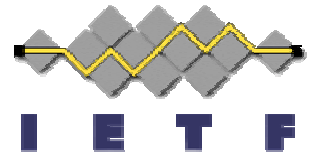
# Who We Are This Time

- 1199 paid registrations so far
  - Vancouver 11/05 : 1240 total
- 41 countries
  - Vancouver 11/05 : 40



*480 people attended the social sponsored by Siemens; hundreds attended the reception sponsored by Afilias*



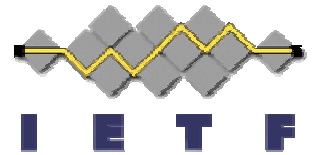


# IETF Activity since Montreal

- 2 new WGs, 12 WGs closed
  - Approximately 120 WGs currently chartered
- 440 new I-Ds (53% in last 4 weeks)
- 933 updated I-Ds (58 % in last 4 weeks)
- 122 IETF Last Calls
- 104 approvals (50 standards/BCP)

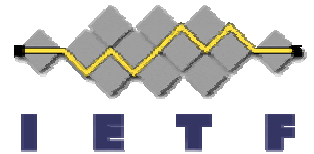

# RFC Editor Actions July-September



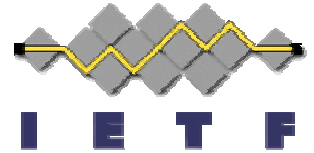
- Published 99 RFCs of which
  - 52 were IETF standards track or BCP
  - 35 were IETF Informational or Experimental
  - 12 were from other sources
- Queue length reduced from 174 to 150
- After 20+ years of service to the community, Joyce Reynolds has left ISI .
- “IETF Trust” copyright as of November 1, 2006.

# IANA Actions



- Processed 505 IETF-related requests since June 1
  - Queue is ~77 requests
  - ~120 port requests since IETF 66
    - Queue is ~20 requests
  - ~40 MIME type requests since IETF 66
    - Queue is almost empty
- Reviewed all I-Ds in Last Call or IESG Review
- Executed IANA Actions for RFCs in progress
- Very close to a final SLA with the IAOC and IAB
- Improving tools and metrics

# Montreal budget outcome (preliminary)

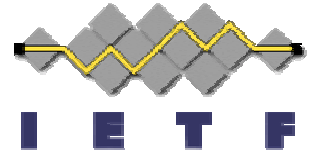


- Total meeting income: \$784k
- Total meeting expense: \$362k
- Surplus contributed to IASA budget: \$422k



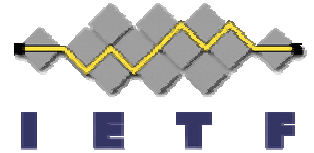
# IASA budget status

## 2006-09-30 (approximate)



- Cash flow to date
  - Planned: \$2,791,888
  - Actual: \$2,574,401
    - Meetings: \$1,578,427
    - ISOC: \$995,974
- Of which we spent
  - \$1,652,099 on secretariat and meeting costs (about 50:50)
  - \$576,423 on RFC Editor
  - \$345,879 on general IASA costs
- Expect to end year very close to budgeted cash flow
- Planned budget for 2007: \$4.1m
  - ISOC income: \$1,650,000 (includes sponsorships)
  - Meetings income: \$2,478,000
    - Assuming meeting fee raised to \$600

- Issued RFP for RFC Editor contract; signed Lol last week.
- Finalized text of SLA with IANA.
- Issued FAQ on use of RFC material by third parties.
- Issued FAQ on use of IETF logo and trademarks.

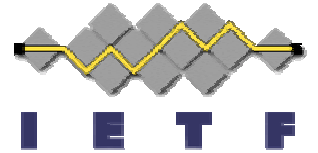

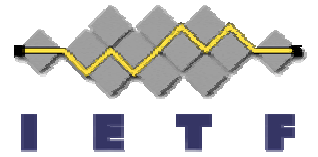
